

A Word from the Directors...

The story of PIPPIN you are about to see is not real.

The historical figures mentioned, and the Holy Roman Emperor Charlemagne in particular, may have been actual people, but their exploits as depicted in this show are not based on actual events.

The very world in which the story unfolds has been designed deliberately not to reflect a particular time period or actual place. It is, rather, meant to represent the blank slate of possibility a young person might envision in their mind and heart as they teeter on the edge of the future.

PIPPIN attempts to show us what growing up feels like, to materialize the excitement and confusion and despair and joy of finding one's place in the world. On the brink of adulthood stands a young man, with the all the possibilities of what life may have in store glimmering temptingly before him, embodied by the colorful and glamorous troupe in their wagon full of tricks. He must make choices, and he is certainly going to make mistakes. It is important to note that Pippin himself is not one of the Players. He is the one the story is happening to, but he does not know how the story will end. They Players have come here, now, for him, to show him what his life could be if only he would follow their lead.

At its core, PIPPIN is about the journey to fulfillment we all must embark upon in order to truly grow up. It is about the allure of the nebulous "something better" that may lie beyond our present circumstances. It's about the excitement and, ultimately, the danger in pursuing that ineffable something instead of embracing what we already have. It is not a "spoiler" to reveal that the young man at the center of this story is unable to find complete, total, ultimate fulfillment in any of the possibilities presented by the Players. What he does find, he finds for and within himself.

It doesn't get much more real than that.
