

A WORD FROM THE DIRECTORS...

Near the end of *Urinetown*, in response to the events that have unfolded throughout, a character asks, "What kind of musical is this?!" We realize you may already be asking this question.

For starters, it's the only musical that takes its inspiration from a European pay toilet. Librettist and lyricist Greg Kotis was on a backpacking trip and found himself very low on funds in Paris. While he considered whether to use some of his few remaining precious coins to use a public restroom, the idea occurred to him of a city where citizens must pay a fee every time they use a toilet. He approached composer and lyricist Mark Hollmann to collaborate with him in bringing the story to life on the musical stage, a task that took years. The creators have said that the premise was so ridiculous that they figured no one would ever produce it, so they were free to take their time – and lots of fun creative risks – building the show. And then produce it someone did! *Urinetown* struck a chord with audiences and critics, and now many years, three Tony Awards, and countless amateur productions later, here we are.

Urinetown, our tenth PV Theatre musical as directors, breaks the mold of the shows that came before it in the musical theatre canon and remains quite unlike anything that has come after. The high-energy musical numbers feel comfortably familiar, but the characters that talk directly to you and seem to be aware that they're in a show are a little unsettling. Rest assured, that's as it should be.

Urinetown would not be possible without the influence and inspiration of the German playwright and director Bertolt Brecht. His goal was to distance the audience from the illusion of the world of the play and force them to confront the realities of its story. His ideal use of theatre was to entertain and educate. At PV Theatre, we strive to combine those same ideals in each of the shows we produce.

Brecht believed that by reminding audiences that they were watching a piece of theatre they would be less likely to get emotionally invested in the characters' problems and instead think about – and act on – the real-world problems being presented.

Urinetown offers plenty to think about, and raises plenty of questions to which it provides no answers. How do we use, abuse, conserve, and control our most precious resources? Do the idealists or the pragmatists hold the key to our future? Whose job is it to protect the people? What do they most need to be protected from? As you watch, consider the goals, values, and tactics of the story's central characters. In this world, the good guys aren't always so good, the bad guys aren't pure evil, and they are locked in a battle for nothing less than the survival of the human race.

While you're doing all that thinking, don't forget to laugh. *Urinetown* is, above all, a comedy. If you're a fan of musical theatre, try to spot the subtle and not-so-subtle nods to other shows woven into every facet of this production. If you're not as well-versed in musical theatre, enjoy the way the show makes fun of itself. Regardless of how you found your way here today, we're grateful you're going to spend a couple of hours with us laughing – and thinking – about the world we've created.
